## Frightful crocodile

Don't worry! They're quite friendly! Even though this involves a group of frightful, terrifying and horror inducing crocodiles living in a still, dark inlet of the Nile. Ifyou choose different shades from the PRECIOSA PermaLux range, you will be able to create your own patterns and use the tutorial to sew a figure that makes you happy.

## Materials and tools:

PRECIOSA Rocailles (R)

## the upper surface

22m16 wintergreen matt; 104x (R16)

- 0.30 mm nylon line (rigid with a slight elasticity); scissors; a ruler

- the hanging (necklace) - a thin chain or a cord with a 1 mm diameter; a carabiner; its counterpart; a thin ring; 4 mm rings (4x); end pieces with a 2 mm internal diameter; glue for absorbent - non-absorbent material (for example, for strass stones)



## Difficulty:

Technique: ladder chain stitch
Procedure:
Step 1
The line
Cut off about 1.5 m of the line.
If the line twists, gently pass the needle over it or tug on it. String the $\mathbf{R}$ directly onto the line.


## Step 2

The beginning
String 1x R16 and 2x Ro6. Move them to the centre of the line. Thread the end of the line on the side by the R16 back through 2x Ro6 again. This will create a triangle.



## The body

Step 3
When creating the crocodile, alternately string the $\mathbf{R}$ from the supper surface (the pattern) and the $\mathbf{R}$ from the bottom (Ro6). The numbers in the rows reduce or increase. This imitates the narrowing or widening of the animal's body. String the appropriate number of $\mathbf{R}$ in a row onto one end of the line. Thread the second end of the line through from the opposite side.

The sewing principle



## The legs

Step 4
String $3 \times$ R16. Omit the R strung on the edge. Thread the line through the remaining $2 x \mathbf{R}$ back to the body.



The lower surface


Step 5
Finishing up
String $1 x$ R16 from the tail (row 25) onto one end of the line. Thread this end of the line back through the last two pairs of $\mathbf{R}$ in the tail. Thread each end of the line through ${ }_{1 \times} \mathbf{R}$ next to the penultimate pair of $\mathbf{R}$.
Tie two knots between the $\mathbf{R}$.
Thread the line back through the $\mathbf{R}$ in this pair. Pull the ends of the line into several other pairs of $\mathbf{R}$. Cut it off.


## Hanging - the necklace

Step 6
Cut off the required length from the chain or the cord. Stick the cord into the end pieces with eyes. Use the 4 mm rings
to connect a carabiner and its counterpart
to the eyes on the end pieces or to the ends of the chain. Connect the thin ring to
the outer $\mathbf{R}$ on the crocodile.
Connect both 4 mm rings to it, which you can then hang on the cord or the centre of the chain.
